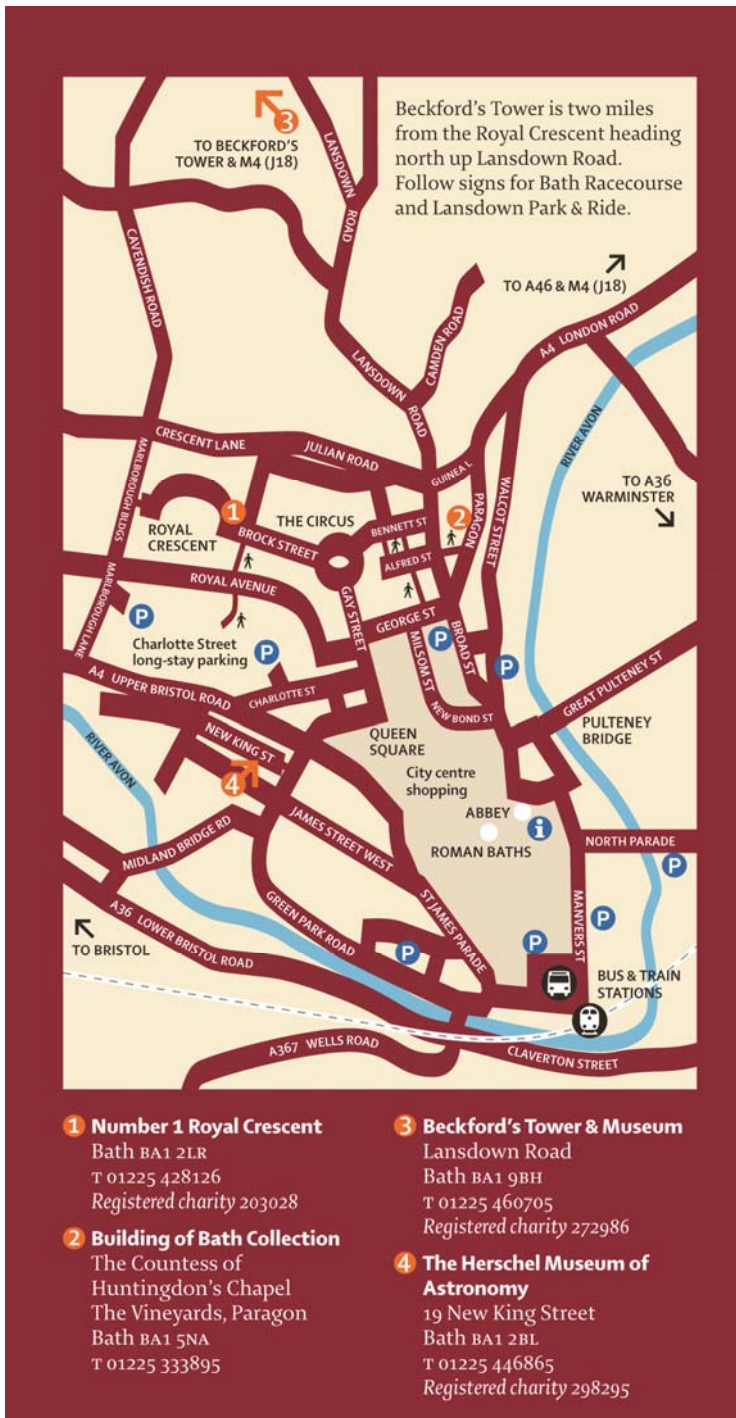


How to find the Building of Bath Collection

Building of Bath Collection, Countess of Huntingdon's Chapel, Paragon, Bath BA1 5NA



The Building of Bath Collection is housed in the Countess of Huntingdon's Chapel in central Bath.

If you are travelling by car, it is best to park at the Lansdown Park and Ride and the bus will drop you off at the bottom of Lansdown Road, next to Alfred Street. You can then walk down the pedestrian passage 'Hay Hill' (opposite Alfred Street) and turn left onto the raised pavement of the Paragon. Look out for an iron gate on the left with 'Countess of Huntingdon's Chapel' written on the overthrow. Go through the first gate and to the end of the courtyard to find the entrance to the Building of Bath Collection.

If you plan to bring your car into the city, the best car parking option is the Charlotte Street car park, shown on the map to the left.

The Building of Bath Collection is approximately 15 minutes walk from Bath bus and train stations. The easiest walking route is to walk up Manvers Street, follow the road past the Guildhall and go up Broad Street. At the top of Broad Street, turn right on to the Paragon and then cross the road to reach the raised pavement.
